Wooster is proud to announce a new, professional microfiber roller cover line that is the perfect choice for painters looking for a high-production microfiber cover.

Microfiber roller covers have always been known for their ability to achieve very smooth, spray-like finishes, but at the cost of slower production times. Now, Wooster offers the perfect solution with this new microfiber line. These new, microfiber roller covers are engineered specifically to pickup and release more paint than any other microfiber roller covers on the market today. This helps to increase production time, while still delivering the smooth, even finish that is expected from a microfiber roller.

They are made using a high-capacity and shed-resistant European fabric; these rollers are designed for use in all paints, stains, and enamels, but excel in lower sheen (flat and eggshell) applications. I just spent money on my very first, top-of-the line Wooster paintbrush? How do I take care of my investment?



Believe it or not, there are good and bad ways to care for your Wooster tools. Proper care will help them maintain their high-performance levels. Here are some common practices that we would and wouldn't recommend.

DO Read the Label

Nearly every coating manufacturer provides very specific cleaning instructions for the paints and/or stains that they produce. Their labs have already done all of the hard work for you—these tips have been tested and proven successful—they'll often be the easiest way to get your tools ready for the next job. DON'T Soak Brushes/Roller Covers for Long Periods

Soaking tools briefly can sometimes be a good way of jump starting your cleanup after a day of painting. A painter once contacted us upset after leaving a brush in solvent for a month. Even though many Wooster tools are designed to be solvent-resistant, our tools are *never* meant to be stored in solvents.

DO Keep Your "Keeper"

It's just a piece of cardboard packaging, right? Wrong. After cleaning and allowing it to dry, placing a brush back in its keeper protects it and helps maintain a brush's shape when not in use. Likewise, saving a roller bag is the best way to keep rollers free of dust and debris until they're ready to be used again. Always wait until a roller cover is fully dry before placing it back in its bag; putting it away too early is an easy way to promote mold growth.



DON'T Tape Your Roller Covers

Even though some painters recommend this, wrapping tape around a roller can potentially break roller fibers from their backing and create more lint in your finish. If shedding is a concern, prewet the cover and spin it out prior to use; or switch to a woven roller with reduced shedding.

DO Mark Your Tools

Many modern applicators are meant to be universal (use with all paints). However, they can't go back and forth; once a brush or roller has been used in oil-based paints, for instance, it can only be used in oil-based coatings moving forward. This is true no matter how well a brush or roller is cleaned after use.





Ask a painter or contractor if having to stop and retighten tools while on the job annoys or slows them down, they often say "yes" right away.

Wooster's Grip Tip™ technology, a key component in Sherlock GT® Convertible™ poles, locks tools in place. Wooster GT tools will stay put until the work is done. Tools that don't loosen during the job not only save you time, they make your work even more precise. When you're not using a Wooster GT tool, these poles convert to threads by attaching the adapter that is conveniently stored in the grip.

So, in order to illustrate just how these poles are able to help you do more, we conducted an experiment. On average, connecting a threaded tool to an extension pole took approximately 3 seconds.

Connecting a Wooster GT pole to a Sherlock GT Convertible pole took approximately 1 second.

It doesn't sound like much at first; but if you expand that to just four times a day (starting work, lunch break, resuming work, and end of day) it starts to add up. By switching to a Sherlock GT Convertible pole, a pro instantly gets eight seconds back each day. Eight seconds isn't all that much, right?

What about those seconds occurring when you have to stop and retighten a tool that's "attached" to a threaded pole? How much time would that cost you? At say two seconds per tighten?

Stopping to retighten 1 time/hour = 1 hour 44 minutes/year. If your painting career lasts for 25 years, that adds up to nearly 43-1/3 hours of work wasted.

Stopping to retighten 5 times/hour = 8 hours 40 minutes/year. If your painting career lasts for 25 years, that adds up to over 216 hours of work wasted.
